



## **The Adagio Module you don't think you need, until you have it!**

Adagio GridView is a read-only query tool designed to put information in front of the people who need it without giving them access to the accounting programs.

Here are a few examples of GridView solutions we have created:

- A company manager needed accurate, up-to-date information on Accounts Receivable, including the ability to drill-down to the invoices, so she could do collections by telephone. A two-view report into the Adagio Receivables data base did the job.
- Project Managers were constantly asking the accounting department to run reports showing the current costs of their projects, vs budget. Now, that information is on each Project Manager's desktop with a view into Job Costing.
- A company wanted a quick, simple telephone list of customers. This view, with contact names, was put on the appropriate desktops, and is also available in the menus within Receivables and Invoices.
- At a First Nation's band office, the Housing Director was always going into the accounting office and asking "Has this fellow made his mortgage payment this month?" This disruption no longer occurs because she can now access a View into Adagio Receivables from her office.
- At another First Nation, the Chief keeps a View with expenses vs budget on his desktop to provide a quick warning of potential problems. His Social Services Director has a similar report for the accounts and departments that relate to her area.
- A delivery company that pays its drivers a percentage of their invoiced revenue has a view that links into the Adagio Invoices history file. After entering a date range, it produces a report that shows the billings for each driver, their share and applicable fuel surcharges. There is both a detailed report and a summary report that gives the payroll clerk the data needed to enter into the payroll program.
- An industrial parts company uses GridView to look up past customer orders when they ask "send me the same stuff as we got last September." Then they drill down to the selling price, inventory detail and the purchase order showing their supplier.

There are many more possibilities. If the information exists in the accounting data, it likely can be extracted and sorted in a way that is helpful and meaningful to various personnel. Ask us.
